English

Our main texts for this half-term are Stone Age Boy and Stig of the Dump. Both of these link with our Stone Age topic and particularly our History. We will spend some time consolidating Year 2 learning and will be extending the children's knowledge of word classes, expanded noun phrases and sentence structure. Our extended writing for this topic will be planning and writing our own Stone Age themed narrative which involves a character from the present going back into the Stone Age to have an adventure.

Our spelling work will focus on recapping of KS1 letters and sounds as well as Year 3 spellings.

Mathematics

We will begin by looking at Place Value and really understand how our number system works, moving from ones to tens, hundreds and thousands. We will explore different ways to represent two- and three-digit numbers before beginning to think about ways to mentally add ones and tens to 3-digit numbers. From here we will look at more formal written methods for solving addition calculations and discuss how addition is commutative.

PE and Games

This term we are developing our understanding of the fundamentals in PE - how exercise and fitness can make us feel and why it is good for us. We will also begin to look at ball skills; throwing and catching as well as passing and stopping a ball with different parts of our foot.

History

Our topic is driven by historical learning and we will be thinking about life and times in prehistory. The children will become familiar with the different eras Palaeolithic, Mesolithic and Neolithic and use timelines to help us with this. Our focus will be on homes and how they changed over the time periods and that Stone Age people were hunter gatherers.

RE

We will explore the Christian faith starting with the Creation in the book of Genesis. From this, we will look at the caring character of God and how human beings are a part of God's creation. We will look at how Christians show their belief in God as the Creator.

STONES AND BONES

YEAR 3 AUTUMN TERM 1

Growing Together to Build our Future

French

This term we will begin our look at the French language by practising a range of greetings and look at numbers 0-10. We will use this new knowledge to ask and answer questions such as; How are you? What is your name? How old are you?

Science

We will be exploring the human body, beginning with finding out about the names and functions of our bones and some of our muscles. Next we will look at nutrition and how humans need to eat the right types and amounts of foods to stay healthy. We will compare human diets with those of animals.

Computing

In computing we will look closely at how networks work and how computers and routers can send information via networks. We will explore sending and receiving messages on the Internet safely and the differences between web links, websites and webpages.

Music

In music, we will be learning about the different interrelated dimensions of dynamics and tempo. We will explore the vocabulary linked to these (eg piano, forte, decrescendo and crescendo. Using syllabic word patters and chants, we will think about linking these rhythms to musical notes.

Art

This half term, we are practising the skill of sketching using very light pressure on our pencil. We will draw a human pose from observation and a Stone Age animal from pictures using ovals and circles to create base shapes.

PSHE

This term we will be focusing on 'Too Much Selfie Isn't Healthy'. We will be making sure we are thinking of others through love, support, respect and appreciation, as well as learning how to respond to an emergency, and when to keep information private.
